

Making the most of new social care and well-being legislation

The Well-Being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2016 is about improving the social, economic, environmental and cultural well-being of Wales and requires public bodies to carry out their work in a sustainable way. The establishment of Public Services Boards (PSBs) will oversee the work of producing wellbeing assessments which looks at evidence covering the economic, social, environmental and cultural well-being of an area.

The Social Services and Well-being (Wales) Act 2014 repealed the majority of community care legislation in Wales when it came into force in 2016. At a strategic level, it requires local authorities and local health boards to jointly carry out an assessment of care and support needs in an area and produce a combined population assessment report.
